Meeting Minutes

Creating a Neighborhood/Guest Speakers: Will Smith and Fay Walker (students of Ken Steif)

- The guest speakers have a project to create a Neighborhood Change Zoning Overlay Plan for the Spruce Hill neighborhood.
- They plan to attend the November 18, 2019 Zoning Committee meeting.
- The goal is to balance new development and increased affordable housing with preservation.
- The zoning overlay means that the community works directly with neighborhood representative to make decisions
- Survey measures preference for preservation using photos of buildings ranging from residential, industrial, and commercial
- SHCA Board members took the survey during the meeting

Halloween Planning/ Guest Speaker: Jamie Vann

- Leslie provided Safety Committee updates on parade and street closure permits, Penn Drumline, table donations, and the participation of the UCD Ambassadors and 18th Precinct for security and enforcement of street closures. The Thriller Dancers will not participate this year, but hope to return in 2020.
- Jamie outlined the the Little Osage block's preparations:
