

HALLOWEEN SCAVENGER HUNT



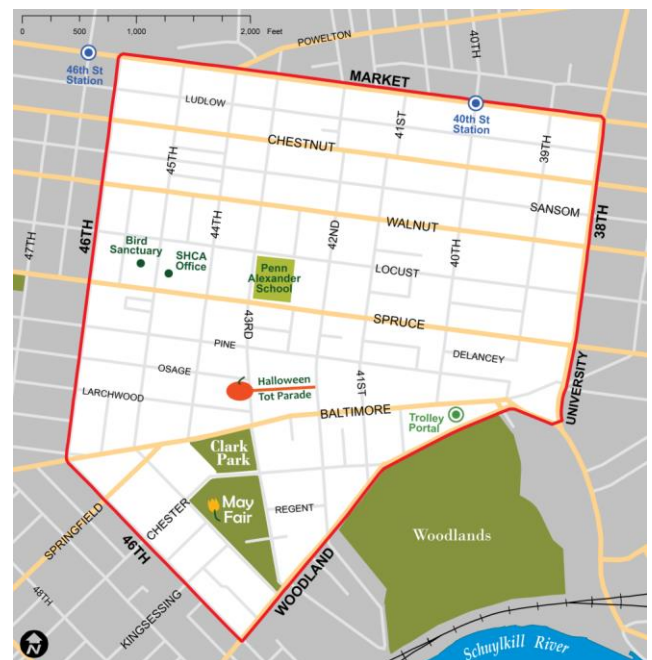
Welcome to the Spruce Hill neighborhood Scavenger Hunt for youth age 17 and under!

The rules are simple! Follow the clues to find the locations of all 10 letters that spell "SPRUCE HILL". All letters are placed in locations visible from sidewalks, pedestrian walkways or streets within the Spruce Hill boundaries shown on the map below. Enter a description of the location of each letter as you find it, and when you have found them all, submit your form!

The first 100 entries with all 10 correct locations will receive a small prize supporting one of our local businesses after the hunt closes. **Deadline for submission is midnight on Sunday, November 1st, 2020.**

Other RULES: To keep this fun and fair for all, please do not share the letter locations with anyone else (e.g., by social media, text or in person). Please leave the letters in place where you find them. Anyone found to have broken these rules will be disqualified from receiving a prize. Young children should be accompanied by an adult. Friends can work together but remember to keep your group small and PLEASE remember to wear a mask and practice social distancing as you search!
