support.





- Noticed neighborhood support and momentum
- Councilmember Anthony Phillips passed a bill to streamline speedbump intallation, so Lea now has speed bumps and Penn Alexander will have them by the spring of 2024.
- Parents of PAS, UCD Director or Planning and Design, Nate Hommell, and Complete Streets DM, Adam Smith, are working on improvements around the Penn Alexander perimeter. Safer crossings at the 43/Spruce intersection will be the first location of improvements






Safe Streets & Commercial Corridors


- Projects



























Crosstown Coalition




